 - 1. Hearken to God, not to man (Gal. 1:8-9; Col. 2:8; 2 John 9).
 - 2. "We saw and heard" (vs. 20; 3:15; 2 Cor. 4:7-15).
- B. A LESSON IN COURAGE.
 - 1. Cowardice of the Council (vs. 21).
 - a. Ill treatment instead of refuting what was said no repentance either.
 - b. Common reaction (Matt. 21:23-27; John 12:42-43).
 - 2. Courage of Peter and John.
 - a. Mark of God's servant (Acts 7:51-52; John 15:18-21).
 - b. **History** teaches us (**Heb. 11:32-40**).
 - c. Luke 6:26.
