 - Many Christians sing with virtually no emotion or do not sing at all! 1.
 - We used to have "valley-wide" singings. What happened? 2.

 - Appreciate the true purpose of singing. 1.
 - 2. Know how we can get more out of singing.
- THE PURPOSE OF SINGING. Ι.

TO PRAISE THE LORD(Acts 16:25). A.

- This is the most popular concept of the purpose of singing. 1.
 - Indeed, this is certainly the idea inherent in the word "HYMN" a.
 - From the Greek, HUMNOS, meaning "a song in praise of." b.
- 2. Praising God should be a natural for Christians!
 - David reacted this way to the God's blessings(Psa. 28:6-7). a.
 - b. How much more should we!
- As "priests" we offer "sacrifices acceptable to God"(1 Pet. 2:5). 3.
 - а Singing is one of the sacrifices' that we offer to God(Heb. 13:15).
 - b. Might we offer defiled service to God?(Mal. 1:7-8, 12-13).
- TO TEACH AND ADMONISH ONE ANOTHER(Col. 3:16; Eph. 5:19). B
 - Teaching and admonishing us to live properly, enjoying our many blessings. 1.
 - Congregational singing" is "congregational teaching"! 2.
 - Singing is a way we can encourage our brethren and ourselves as well! 3.

GETTING MORE OUT OF OUR SINGING. II.

- WE MUST ENGAGE THE "INTELLECT" AS WE SING. A.
 - Remember, singing is "teaching and admonishing one another." 1.
 - a. This assumes that we UNDERSTAND what we sing(1 Cor. 14:15). b. Not just for the pleasure of the sound.
 - Therefore, give careful attention to the WORDS of the song
- 2. WE MUST ALSO ENGAGE THE "EMOTIONS" AS WE SING. B.
 - When we sing, we must do so ... 1.

- a. "with grace in our hearts"(Col. 3:16).
- b. "making melody in your heart"(Eph. 5:19).
- To sing without **EMOTION** (without grace in our hearts)...
- Will be evident in our countenances! (Prov. 15:13). a.
- b. Is hypocritical, and condemned by Jesus! (Matt. 15:7-8).

QUESTIONS TO EVALUATE YOUR SINGING. III.

- DO YOU LIMIT THE SPHERE OF YOUR SINGING? A.
 - Is your singing limited to the assemblies? Do you sing alone, or with others? 1.
 - Singing ought to be spontaneous, arising when circumstances call for it 2. (Acts 16:25; Psa. 34:1-3).
- B. IS THERE LACK OF EMOTION IN YOUR SINGING?
 - As in all that we do for the Lord, with "all" our hearts! (Matt. 22:37). 1.
 - We should not praise the Lord "half-heartedly." Remember(Matt. 15:7-9). 2.
 - We all can and should bless the Lord with their "whole being"!(Psa. 103:1). 3.
- C. DO YOU UNDERSTAND WHAT YOU ARE SINGING?
 - 1. Some songs can be so complicated as to hinder understanding,
 - a. Pace of the song can be so fast we don't absorb the meaning of words.
 - b. The words may be unusual and not understood by the average singer.
 - Song leaders can help by being careful in the songs they select to lead
 - Carefully introducing songs that may be new to the congregation. a.
 - Taking time to explain the meaning of the song or unusual words in it. b.
 - The ultimate responsibility falls on us who sing
- DO YOU STRESS MUSICAL HARMONY TO THE DETRIMENT OF NEW D.
 - God stresses making melody in our hearts over with our voices 1.
 - The emphasis should be on praising God in heart and mind, and not how it may 2.

TESTAMENT SINGING?

sound to the human ear!

- DO YOU HINDER YOUR OWN SINGING BY WHERE YOU SIT?
- 1. Sitting spread out discourages many from singing as they otherwise might.
- 2. People become more involved, are more uplifted, edify others better, when they sit together and close to the song leader.
