# A Closer Walk With God **GROWING IN THE KNOWLEDGE OF JESUS**

## **TEXT: 2 Pet. 3:18**

### **INTRODUCTION:**

- A. WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO GROW IN KNOWLEDGE?( 2 Pet. 1:2-11 ).
- B. HOW CAN WE BE SURE OF GROWTH IN KNOWLEDGE?
- C. WHY SHOULD WE DESIRE TO GROW IN THIS KNOWLEDGE?

#### WHAT "GROWING IN THE KNOWLEDGE OF JESUS CHRIST" INVOLVES. I.

- A. INVOLVES THE DEVELOPMENT OF EIGHT 'GRACES''( 2 Pet. 1:5-7 ).
  - We must "abound" in these eight "graces"( 2 Pet. 1:8 ). 1.
  - 2. More than simply increasing our "intellectual" knowledge! 3.
    - A FULLER AND MORE PERSONAL knowledge of Jesus Christ!
      - Which comes by developing the "Christ-like" attributes defined above. a.
    - The more we grow in these "graces", the more we really "know" Jesus. b.
  - 4. That it involves more than intellectual knowledge is also evident from the Greek word used for knowledge in(2 Pet. 1:2-3, 8).
    - epiginosko, "to become thoroughly acquainted with, to know thoroughly, to a. know accurately, know well" ( Thayer ).
    - Knowledge is demonstrating these graces in our live. b.
- SECOND, IT INVOLVES DEVELOPING THESE "GRACES" IN CONJUNCTION B. WITH EACH OTHER
  - 2 Pet. 1:5, add(or "supply"), epichoregeo, "to furnish besides, i.e. fully supply, 1. (figuratively) aid or contribute"( Strongs ).
    - Before each grace mentioned, the word is implied a.
    - b. Suggests the idea of "each grace working in harmony with the others to produce an overall effect."
  - Notice also the preposition "to" (or "in") in(2 Pet. 1:5-7). This suggests that 2. "each grace is to temper and make perfect the grace that goes before it."
  - Thus each grace is necessary, developed in conjunction with each other. 3.
- THIRD. IT INVOLVES DILIGENT EFFORT. C.
  - 2 Pet.1:5,10. diligence, spoude; "despatch, eagerness, earnestness"( Strong ) 1.
  - We do not "accidently" or "naturally" develop these graces! 2.

### WHY WE SHOULD GROW IN KNOWLEDGE OF JESUS. II.

- GRACE AND PEACE ARE MULTIPLIED IN KNOWLEDGE( 2 Pet. 1:2). A.
  - 1. All men experience God's favor to some degree( Matt. 5:45 ).
  - Only in Christ can one enjoy the "fulness" of God's favor and peace 2. (Eph. 1:3; Phi 4:6-7).
- 2 Pet. 1:3-4. THROUGH THIS KNOWLEDGE GOD GRANTS US: B.
  - All things that pertain to life and godliness. 1.
    - "Life" in this context refers to our spiritual life and well-being. a.
    - "Godliness," the pious conduct which comes out of devotion to God. b.
  - Precious and exceeding great promises(Gen. 3:15; 12:1-3). 2.
  - The object? "Partakers of the Divine Nature"( Col. 3:9-10 ). 3.
  - A result of escaping the corruption of the world SIN! 4.
  - FAILURE RESULTS IN SPIRITUAL MYOPIA AND AMNESIA( 2 Pet. 1:9).
  - The object of being a Christian is to be like Christ! (Rom. 8:29). 1.
    - 2. Failure to so grow is an indication that we forgot why we were redeemed by the blood of Christ in the first place!
      - To have our sins forgiven, yes... a.
      - And that we might become what He wants us to be LIKE HIS SON! b.
    - WE WILL NEVER STUMBLE( 2 Pet. 1:10 ).
    - But we do sin( 1 John 1:8, 10). 1

- Sin results from digressing from these graces. 2.
  - ENTRANCE INTO THE "EVERLASTING KINGDOM" (2 Pet. 1:11).
  - Referred to by Paul in( 2 Tim. 4:18), the ultimate destiny of the redeemed. 1.
  - What is meant by the idea of an "abundant entrance"? 2.
    - "You may be able to enter, not as having escaped from a shipwreck, or a. from fire, but as it were in triumph'(Bengel).
    - b. By possessing the eight graces, we will be able to live victoriously in this life and to joyously anticipate what lies ahead( 2 Tim. 4:6-8 ).

### **CONCLUSION:**

- A. WE SHOULD BE SUFFICIENTLY MOTIVATED TO GROWTH.
- B. WE MUST GIVE DILIGENCE TO GROW.
- C. HAVE WE FORGOTTEN WE WERE PURGED FROM OUR OLD SINS?
  - 1. We have, if we are apathetic in our desire to grow in these "graces"!
    - 2. If so, we need to **repent** and **pray** for forgiveness!
